

# The Good Word



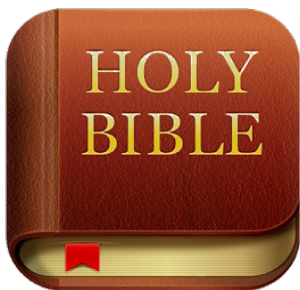
*Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.
